




SHARE THE ROAD
Some streets have markings for bikes, but not a separate lane. These are called "sharrows." Ride as if you were a car, and they pass you.



A LANE FOR YOU
When riding on a street with a bike lane, ride in the direction indicated by the bike symbol. Signal and look before changing lanes. Never ride against the flow of traffic!




HANG A LEFT
You may turn left just like a vehicle by merging into the left lane or left side of a single lane. Or dismount and walk your bike as a pedestrian using crosswalks.



POINT & GO
Signal turns by pointing in the direction you will be turning. It's courtesy, self-protection, and the law!



BE BRIGHT
Riding at night is fun! Use extra caution, wear reflective and light-colored clothing, and use lights on the front and rear of your bike. It's the law!




LOCK IT UP
Lock to a bike rack when possible. Check that your anchor cannot be pulled out of the ground and is not already cut or broken. Don't forget your wheels!



GIVE IT A BRAKE
Always obey signs, signals, and markings while you ride. Be sure to check posted rules in parks or paths, as they may have specific rules for bikes.




CAP IT OFF
Your helmet should be snug, cover the top of your head, and not rock forward. MA law requires that anyone under 17 wear a helmet when riding.



SPACE...TRUCKIN'
Trucks have huge blind spots and make very wide turns. Avoid riding to the right of trucks, and pass when driver has seen you.



CONCRETE JUNGLE
Avoid potholes, gravel, broken glass, drain grates, and other road hazards. Be sure to look over your shoulder before moving into traffic.



THE DOORS
Ride at least 3 feet away from parked cars, and be aware of cars that are turning or have just parked. Someone may open the door without looking.



MEAN RIGHT HOOK
Avoid passing any vehicle on the right. If there is a bicycle lane, be cautious near intersections and driveways, particularly with parking garages.

GETTING AROUND

Following the same rules as other vehicles makes you predictable, and greatly reduces the likelihood of a crash. Obeying the law also sends the message that you belong on the road and that you respect other road users. Being courteous to drivers, pedestrians, and other riders on the road may remind them to be courteous to other cyclists that they encounter on the road.

TAKING PRECAUTIONS

Know where drivers' blind spots are, and avoid riding in them. Never assume a driver has seen you, and avoid passing vehicles near intersections. Don't follow other riders or vehicles too closely, and let others pass if they are following you too closely. A 2 to 4 second gap in front of you is considered an ideal following distance.

AVOIDING HAZARDS

When riding, remember the golden rule: Do unto others as you would have them do unto you. When users as humans, your ride may be more enjoyable and less stressful. Make eye contact with others, wave when someone gives you right of way, and don't forget to ring your bell to say hello.


ABOUT URBAN ADVENTOURS
