Suggested Reading Comprehension Assessment Activities:

- Make a newspaper article (use Microsoft Word Publisher for a template). (Ch. 1, Ch. 8 or Ch. 9)
- Make a brochure with pictures and facts about gray whales. (Ch. 2)
- Create a timeline that includes both the events in the novel and historical information of the time. Try using Post-Its on a

whiteboard or butcher paper. (Ch. 1-10)

- Act out the story or dramatize a scene. (Ch. 1-10)
- Write a letter to Lily. (Ch. 1-10)
- Write a journal, from Lily's point of view, recording her journey. (Ch. 1-10)
- Make a "Captain's log" and write down current whale sightings for 5 days in a row using www.dolphinsafari.com. Highly recommend going to www.whalewatchingtv.com and watching a live whale and dolphin excursion. (Ch. 1-10)
- Draw or build a replica of Captain Dave's boat, Manute'a. (Ch. 4 and p.192)
- Be a TV or radio reporter, and give a report of a scene from the story as if it is happening "live". (Ch. 8)
- Write a biography report on the men who saved Lily. (Ch. 8)
- Participate in a community service project with Kids Around the World. Visit www.kidsaroundtheworld.com for more volunteer information. (Ch. 10)

Additional Activities After the Entire Book Has Been Read:

- Write Captain Dave a letter and tell him how you can be a Caretaker.
- Make a book report.
- Write a one page "pitch" to a producer explaining why the story would make a great movie.
- Create an informative poster about Lily's journey.
- Whale and dolphin field trip with Captain Dave's Dolphin and Whale Safari.
