



Traveling with your Service Animal

It is the policy of the IFA that Service Animals are allowed on all areas of the passenger deck. Here are a few things you need to understand and agree to when traveling with your Service Animal:

- Your animal is trained as a service animal and the service it provides is directly related to the functional limitation(s) of your disability;
- Service Animals are not pets. Pets are not allowed on the passenger deck of IFA vessels;
- Service Animals must remain on leash and under the control of the animal's partner/owner during the entire voyage on IFA vessels;
- Control of the Service Animal is the responsibility of the animal's partner/owner. Accountability for damages or injuries shall remain with the person responsible for the animal;
- Service Animals must stand, sit or lay on the floor in a manner that does not block passenger aisles, and Service Animals do not get on furniture or equipment;
- The IFA requires that any animal that is a threat to the health or safety of others will be removed to the car deck and secured in vehicle or pet carrier regardless of training it has received or function it serves for its owner; and
- If a Service Animal displays behavior that poses a direct threat to the health and safety of others, it will be exempt from this Service Animal Policy and not allowed on the passenger deck of IFA vessels during future voyages.
