#### LONG-AWAITED BANNERMAN ISLAND RESIDENCE STABILIZATION PROJECT BEGINS!

The Bannerman Castle Trust, Inc. is pleased to announce that after much planning and anticipation, The Bannerman Island Residence Emergency Stabilization Project is under way and going strong! The project will be completed on or about the first week of July 2011. The Bannerman Castle Trust, Inc. received an Environmental Protection Fund (EPF) Challenge Grant to stabilize Frank Bannerman's historic and endangered residence, located on Pollepel Island in the Hudson River. The grant match is funded in part by generous donations from various private foundations and individuals, as well as by grants from The Dutchess County Industrial Development Agency, Senator Stephen Saland (a member item for masonry repair), The Dyson Foundation, and Ginsburg Development, among others.

After receiving the EPF Grant, the Bannerman Castle Trust, Inc. advertised for preservation architects and selected Jan Hird Pokorny Associates (JPA) of New York City to design emergency measures to preserve and protect the former Bannerman residence. In 2009, following review and approval of the project design by the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, The Bannerman Castle Trust, Inc. advertised for construction contractors and provided a site tour to 37 representatives from various contractors/prospective bidders. The lowest qualified bid was submitted by Ken McShea House Doctor, who is currently constructing the stabilization project, under the oversight of Michael Devonshire and Kurt Hirschberg of JPA. The Bannerman Family Residence (part of the Bannerman Castle complex) was constructed and expanded between 1908 and 1918 to resemble a Scottish castle by Frank Bannerman IV. Bannerman lived at his castle warehouse during the summer, where he stored and sold antique military equipment from the Spanish American War and the U.S. Civil War. Bannerman's business was perhaps the first 'Army Navy Store' in the country, and he is credited with saving both Civil War and Spanish American War relics. (continued page 3)

#### BCT WELCOMES NEW BOARD AND ADVISORY COUNCIL MEMBERS!

The BCT Board of Directors is pleased to announce the election of *Robert McKenna* a BCT Director and co-founder of the BCT, to the position of Vice President.

A native of the Hudson Valley, Robert grew up in Hyde Park and graduated from Our Lady of Lourdes High School in Poughkeepsie. He is married with four children and four grandchildren. Robert and his wife, Mary Anne, have lived in New Paltz for twenty-two years. He retired in 2009 after 31 years of municipal government service. Robert holds a B.S. degree in Psychology from Fordham University and an M.P.A. in Government from Pace University. Currently, Robert works for the U.S. Census Bureau and acted as Director of Planning and Development, City of Newburgh, NY from 2002-2008. He was responsible for the city's planning and economic development programs, where he made successful applications for numerous grants, including New York Main Street and New York Department of State waterfront revitalization programs. He served as Administrative Director of the Newburgh Industrial Development Agency, overseeing the development and completion of the city's 2008 Master Plan. He also served as Acting City Manager for six months, 2003-2004. Robert was the Director of Housing and Community Renewal for the City of Newburgh from 1988-2002.

He is responsible for planning and administering the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for the City of Newburgh (\$1 million annually), which funded and/or assisted in the development of over 500 units of affordable housing. He oversaw the completion and submission of the city's Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan to New York State. Community involvement includes former member of Board of Directors of Amos and Sarah Holden Home in Newburgh, as well as a former member of the Parish Council (three years as president) at St. Joseph's Roman Catholic Church in New Paltz. Robert is also a New York State High School Track and Field Officer and is one of the founding members of The Bannerman Castle Trust, Inc.

The BCT welcomes *John Lanc* to the BCT Advisory Council. John is a principal engineer for Lanc and Tully Engineers and Land Surveyors. His firm provides municipal engineering services to the Towns of Hamptonburgh, Chester, Mamakating and Wawarsing; the Villages of Monroe, Montgomery, Harriman; Goshen, Walden, and, the City of Beacon.

#### LONG-AWAITED BANNERMAN ISLAND RESIDENCE STABILIZATION PROJECT BEGINS!

The residence was the last major structure built on the island and represents an exceptional example of Americana architecture at the turn of the century. The structures on Bannerman Island were built according to Bannerman's unique vision and were constructed from recycled materials, including Victorian bed frames and 1901 'rod' bayonets. Bannerman Castle is the only castle of its kind in the world, and without emergency measures to stabilize and preserve it, we will lose this important Hudson River landmark.


The Bannerman Residence Stabilization represents an initial phase to protect the residence and includes installation of a new roof system, new first and second floors, a set of temporary stairs, and security panels/ shutters. The stabilization measures are intended to protect the structure from the elements and to reinforce the building shell. (Historic and interior finishes are not included in this project. Electrical facilities are also not included in this project, as green technology is being investigated. )

The Bannerman Castle Trust, Inc. would like to thank all of our donors, as well as the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, Grants Office; Jan Hird Pokorny Associates; Ken McShea House Doctor; Hudson River Adventures; M & T Bank, Beacon; and all of the volunteers and friends who are making this project possible.

Based on current construction estimates, there will be additional matching funds available from the EPF Grant that may be used for the emergency stabilization of the remaining tower walls (the larger 'warehouse' castle on the island) that survived the tragic 2009/10 collapse. We need to raise an additional \$120,000 that can be matched in order to design and initiate a shoring and bracing system to secure the iconic tower wall. 




