Full of nerves and giggles the kids come to us, strung out through the boat ramp parking lot like a flock of sheep heading to the barn for dinner. They cluster at the top of the dock to be snapped securely into life jackets. For the most part they speak to one another in quiet

murmurs. Teachers organize the groups and off to the boats they go. The anticipation is palpable. All eyes and ears are on the boat captains as they go over the rules for the day. (There aren't many, but the ones we have are important.) And off they go, calling goodbyes to the friends on other boats as if they will never see each other again. A few short hours later, back they come. We hear them almost before we see them. They've had an adventure, for sure... climbing and jumping and swimming and wading and holding tiny creatures with so many legs, and counting butterflies and watching parent geese and tasting flowers and leaves and having themselves the BEST TIME EVER! They've learned Cherokee history and geology and where animals live and how plants and animals adapt to where they live, and they may not remember it all but one thing is for sure: they have learned to LOVE Jocassee. And they sing their love in a short song they all learn, at the top of their lungs, over and over and over. TEARS AND CHEERS. There is really nothing quite like it. 6 boats full of kids, coming in from an outing on Lake Jocassee, singing and cheering at the top of their lungs about their wonderful day. It's enough to make a grown man tear up. (please don't tell anyone). Nearly 200 kids went through our Jocassee Wild Child program this week, with several weeks to go before summer break. Kerry Mckenzie heads our Wild Child work and has taken the program, which got flattened in its infancy by Covid, to the

### Oconee Station State Historic Site Park Grounds Open Daily: 9:00 AM-5:00 PM

Originally a military compound and later a trading post, this Historic Site offers both recreational opportunities and a unique look at 18th and 19th century South Carolina. A self-interpretation station is available at the park office.

Table Rock State Park May 4: 2:00-10:00 AM Sunrise Hike-Table Rock incredible place we are now. 600+ plus kids this spring, and many more this fall. 11 elementary schools so far, spread out over 4 Upstate counties. It is good work, important work, and we are all thrilled to see it thrive and grow. Watch the video attached to see and hear some kids coming into the dock. And bring a hanky. You may need it. (We won't tell anyone.) ~B

Jocassee's lake level was down about 5' most of the week which gave us plenty of places to beach the boats and let over 150 school kids from 3 different schools get off to explore, play and swim along the shores of the lake. For most, it was their first time experiencing the wonders of Jocassee. These kids romped and plaved alongside South Carolina's state butterfly, the Eastern Tiger Swallowtail, which at times were more numerous than the kids. This species can have 3 generations per year. The caterpillar (larva stage) feeds on leaves of the common tulip poplar tree. The lower lake level also gave us a chance to peek in on the resident beaver family living in the upper lake. These industrious critters subsist on woody and aquatic vegetation and had collected a substantial supply of sweet birch branches to eat. The tender bark and cambium layer offer nutrients, minerals, starches, sugar and fiber which keep these mammals healthy, plus taste great too. We pulled one floating branch from outside the den to smell and taste. No wonder beavers like this tree! If you haven't tried it, think wintergreen or hints of root beer. Yum! Even the kids were pleasantly surprised. The swimming and jumping off of rocks into the lake continued on Friday, even though it was overcast with slightly cooler air & water temps, but that doesn't stop a Jocassee Wild Child as you well know! ~ Sheryl White, JLT guide
